Luke 10:25-37

25 Then an expert in the law stood up to test him, saying, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

26 "What is written in the law?" he asked him. "How do you read it?"

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³⁰ Jesus took up the question and said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him, beat him up, and fled, leaving him half dead. ³¹ A priest happened to be going down that road. When he saw him, he passed by on the other side. ³² In the same way, a Levite, when he arrived at the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. ³³ But a Samaritan on his journey came up to him, and when he saw the man, he had compassion. ³⁴ He went over to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on olive oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal,

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brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵ The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him. When I come back I'll reimburse you for whatever extra you spend.'

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THE GOOD SAMARITAN

Luke 10:25-37

³⁰ Jesus took up the question and said: "**A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him, beat him up, and fled, leaving him half dead.**"

The dangerous road from Jerusalem to Jericho descends ~3,000 feet in 17 miles and robbers often hid along the road.

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THE GOOD SAMARITAN

Luke 10:25-37

- One who is expected to love others
- Avoided the wounded man on the road

Priest



- Descendants of Levi but not of Aaron
- Assisted priests in the temple
- Also avoided the wounded man

Levite



- Mixed Jewish and Gentile ancestry
- Scorned by Jews
- Not seen as neighbors
- Helped the man and paid his expenses

Samaritan



³⁶ "Which of these three do you think **proved to be a neighbor** to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?"

Jesus inverted the Lawyer's definition of neighbor. He changed it from a noun to a verb!

³⁷ "The one who showed mercy to him," he said. Then Jesus told him, "**Go and do the same.**"

The Greek word (*poiei*) in this context implies continuous action.

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DELIBERATE DISCIPLESHIP

- Love for God expresses itself in a life that is sensitive to others. We are to see others as God sees them and we are to act toward them as He does.
- Neighbors can come from surprising places, the real issue is not whom we should serve, but that we serve.
- We are not to ask who our neighbor is; we are to be a neighbor by the way we act toward them.
