




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

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## **JOURNEY TO JERUSALEM**

Luke 9:51-19:44

- Acceptance/Rejection vs. Authentication
- > Focused on Teaching: Sayings & Parables (17) dominate
- Miracles Scarce (4 here vs. 13 during Galilean ministry)
- During the "Journey"
  - Jesus began to complete His early mission
  - Prepare His disciples for His death
  - Challenge the Jewish leaders
  - Continue to move toward Jerusalem

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## **REJECTION IN SAMARIA**

Luke 9:51-56

<sup>51</sup> When the days were coming to a close for him to be taken up, he determined to journey to Jerusalem. <sup>52</sup> He sent messengers ahead of himself, and on the way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make preparations for him. <sup>53</sup> But **they did not welcome him**, because he determined to journey to Jerusalem. <sup>54</sup> When the disciples James and John saw this, they said, "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?"

<sup>55</sup> But he turned and rebuked them, <sup>56</sup> and they went to another village.

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# REJECTION IN SAMARIA

Luke 9:51-56

- What significant event on the horizon prompted Jesus' journey to Jerusalem? (9:51)
- Who were the Samaritans and why is it significant that Jesus traveled through Samaria? (9:52)
- **▶** Why didn't the Samaritans welcome Jesus? (9:53)
- Why were the Samaritans offended by Jesus' determination to reach Jerusalem? (9:53)
  - Samaritans worshiped at Mount Gerizim, rather than at Mount Zion
  - Samaritans already felt like second class citizens
  - Jesus chose Jerusalem (Zion) over Gerizim

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# REJECTION IN SAMARIA

Luke 9:51-56

- Why was Jesus' rejection in Samaria important?
  - Rejection was not limited to Jews or to Israel or its leadership
  - Rejection of Jesus was/is widespread
- What did James and John want to do to the Samaritans villagers? Why? (9:54)
- ➤ What did Jesus think of their suggestion? (9:55)
- What did Jesus do about the Samaritans' rejection? (9:56)

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## **FOLLOWING JESUS**

Luke 9:57-62

<sup>57</sup> As they were traveling on the road someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go."

<sup>58</sup> Jesus told him, "Foxes have dens, and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head." <sup>59</sup> Then he said to another, "Follow me."

"Lord," he said, "first let me go bury my father."

<sup>60</sup> But he told him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and spread the news of the kingdom of God."

<sup>61</sup> Another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me go and say goodbye to those at my house."

<sup>62</sup> But Jesus said to him, "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

Luke 9:57-62

Where were Jesus and His disciples when this story began? (9:57)

#### What did Jesus demand from the men?

- Total commitment
  - To be a disciple takes resolve
  - Disciples place Jesus and the kingdom <u>first</u>
  - The choice to follow Jesus is not an easy one

## What's different about one of the men? (9:57, 59, 61)

- ❖ The 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> men volunteered
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> man was called by Jesus

#### How are the three men like each other?

The demands of discipleship are the same no matter how one comes to Jesus

Luke 9:57-62

## Why do you think Jesus reacted so strongly to the second man's request? (9:60)

- Would the man have been traveling with Jesus if his father had already died?
- How would a dead person bury a dead person; what type of death is Jesus talking about?

#### What is Jesus' main point in this passage?

- Jesus' demands are new and radical
- Nothing is to block pursuit of discipleship
- Nothing is to postpone its start
- One cannot follow two things at once; following Jesus means making Him the compass of your life.
- Discipleship is not an emotional decision of one moment in time, but rather a permanent way of life.

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## **DELIBERATE DISCIPLESHIP**

- When someone rejects you because of prejudice or for a petty reason do you handle it like Jesus did?
- Remember Jesus' response to the Samaritans the next time you feel a desire to retaliate or get even.
- With whom in your circle of family or friends can you affirm your desire to completely follow Jesus?
- In what area of life do you struggle to put Jesus first; how can you surrender that area to Him this week?
- Who/what is the compass of your life?

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
