

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JESUS Under SCRUTINY

Luke 14:1-6

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¹ One Sabbath, when he went in to eat at the house of one of the leading Pharisees, they were watching him closely. ² There in front of him was a man whose body was swollen with fluid. 3 In response, Jesus asked the law experts and the Pharisees, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath or not?" ⁴ But they kept silent. He took the man, healed him, and sent him away. 5 And to them, he said, "Which of you whose son or ox falls into a well, will not immediately pull him out on the Sabbath day?" ⁶ They could find no answer to these things.

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JESUS UNDER SCRUTINY

Luke 14:1-6

He took the man, healed him, and sent him away.

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LESSON ON HUMILITY

Luke 14:7-11

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⁷ He told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they would choose the best places for themselves: ⁸ "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, don't recline at the best place, because a more distinguished person than you may have been invited by your host. ⁹ The one who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give your place to this man,' and then in humiliation, you will proceed to take the lowest place.

10 "But when you are invited, go and recline in the lowest place, so that when the one who invited you comes, he will say to you, 'Friend, move up higher.' You will then be honored in the presence of all the other guests. 11 For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Jesus has instructions for the hosts too.

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⁷ He told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they would choose the best places for themselves: ⁸ "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, **don't recline at the best place**, because a more distinguished person than you may have been invited by your host.

Who is Jesus speaking to and what attitude is He addressing?

Jesus tells the guests to act with humility not pride, in every situation.

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LESSON ON GENEROSITY

Luke 14:12-14

¹³ On the contrary, when you host a banquet, invite those who are poor, maimed, lame, or blind. ¹⁴ And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you; for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Jesus tells them not to expect repayment, because their guests can't repay them.

So, for whom are they to do it?

When and where will they be repaid?

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DELIBERATE DISCIPLESHIP

- The kingdom of God belongs to those who are humbly dedicated to Him, not to those in control of the religious institutions and other power structures.
- God desires mercy and compassion from His people and He honors selfless graciousness – humility is to be the mark of the true disciple.
- Be generous without expecting to be paid back pay back hospitality is of no great merit to God.
- The best hospitality is that which is given, not exchanged, and true hospitality is generosity when no motive exists besides giving.
- How often do you eat with someone whose needs you can meet rather than with someone who can repay you?

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
