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Fervent Prayers

Luke 22:39-46

³⁹ He went out and made his way as usual to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples followed him. ⁴⁰ When he reached the place, he told them, "Pray that you may not fall into temptation." ⁴¹ Then he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, knelt down, and began to pray, ⁴² "Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me — nevertheless, not my will, but yours, be done."

⁴³ Then an angel from heaven appeared to him, strengthening him. ⁴⁴ Being in anguish, he prayed more fervently, and his sweat became like drops of blood falling to the ground. ⁴⁵ When he got up from prayer and came to the disciples, he found them sleeping, exhausted from their grief. ⁴⁶ "Why are you sleeping?" he asked them. "Get up and pray, so that you won't fall into temptation."

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PRAYERS OF PREPARATION

- The meal ends and Jesus departs for the Mount of Olives, as was His custom.
- It is now late in the evening and the disciples follow Him to the Garden of Gethsemane.
- The moment has arrived, Jesus' death is imminent, and He's knows it.

This passage provides us with a look at **the "inner" Jesus** as He prepares to face His arrest and death.

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JESUS' WARNING

- Jesus knows that Satan asked for permission to sift Peter and the rest of the disciples.
 - Remember, Jesus warned Peter specifically, but the Greek language suggests that Satan wanted to sift all of the disciples, not just Peter.
- Matthew and Mark record Jesus saying; "The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

Prayer is important because it expresses a need for God and a desire to depend upon Him and rest in His care.

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EMOTIONALLY INTENSE

- Jesus prepares to pray, all alone, and kneels before the Father in humility.
 - Matthew and Mark say that Jesus fell facedown to pray, emphasizing humility when praying to the Father. (Matt 26:39, Mk 14:35)
 - His prayer reveals his mood as he faces death note the double statements of submission to God's will.
- Jesus is <u>intensely emotional</u>, but He makes it clear that His request is less significant than His desire to do God's will.

SERIOUSLY TEMPTING

- Angels appearing from heaven to minister to Jesus is very unusual! It only happened twice between His birth and His resurrection:
 - 1. In the desert after being tempted by Satan for 40-days and 40-nights (Matt. 4:11).
 - 2. Right here in the Garden of Gethsemane, as He is being tempted again!
- When Jesus told the disciples to pray so they would not fall into temptation (v. 40) He was talking to Himself too!

TOTALLY EXHAUSTING

- Why did Jesus need strengthening?
- Because He was in severe anguish!
 - The Greek word used here for agony (agonia) describes a state of extreme mental and emotional strain, anguish and sorrow.
 - Jesus was under severe emotional stress, and the strain was taking a huge physical and emotional toll on Him.

It was so severe that it prompted angels to strengthen Him!

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⁴⁴Being in anguish, he prayed more fervently, and his sweat became like drops of blood falling to the ground.

PAINFULLY EXACTING

- What did Jesus do while the angels ministered to Him?
- He prayed even more fervently!
- The anguish was so severe, and His prayers so fervent, that they <u>caused a very</u> <u>physical reaction from His human body</u>.
- His sweat became like drops of blood falling to the ground!

Jesus said; "I am deeply grieved, to the point of death!" (Matt 26:38; Mark 14:34)

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TRIUMPHANTLY EMPOWERING

- Jesus rose from prayer in triumph and immediately went to find His disciples!
 - He did not run away and hide
 - He did not flee from the enemy
 - . He faced fully into the God's will, and
 - Submitted to the cross, without hesitation.
- He went from grieving to the point of death and sweating drops of blood in prayer to enduring ridicule, mockery, beating, humiliation, torture and death on a cross!
- Don't tell me there's no power in prayer!

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TRIUMPHANTLY FULFILLING

- Why were the disciples sleeping?
- Because they were overwhelmed with sorrow, fatalism, and despair.
- > They had been told that:
 - They were going to abandon the Lord
 - Peter would deny Christ, three times!
 - Jesus would be arrested and go to the cross
- From their perspective, the world had collapsed and there was nothing left to pray for.
- Yet, Jesus urged them over-and-over again to pray, because He knew firsthand the power of prayer!

DELIBERATE DISCIPLESHIP

- This passage gives us an intimate look at the inner Jesus, and we see how He responded to crisis.
- > He honestly bared his innermost thoughts with the Father and even asked if the cup might pass by Him.
- The heart of His prayer shows a commitment to follow God's will, above all else, no matter the cost.
- Jesus, enduring intense, emotional agony, found renewed strength when He openly and honestly shared His thoughts and His feelings with the Father in prayer.
- God responds to open, honest, genuine prayer. He hears and sends His aid to those in need. It may not change the outcome, but it will always change our attitude.
- Have you tried it lately?

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
